If you are seeking the "pro" position, please submit a set of 10-12 sample pictures of your work. If you are accepted to this position, your name will be added to our resource list for future use. As assignments become available, we will contact those on our resource list to see who is available and willing to fulfill the needed work.

Amateurs can email me (website@palmny.org) to let me know of their desire to send us pictures of an event, activity, conference, etc. they are attending for potential publication on our website.

You will not be paid for the pictures you take, nor will we reimburse you for any expenses you may have incurred while doing your photo shoot. However, IF WE ASK you to cover an event that requires an admission fee, PaLM will reimburse you the admission fee.

All pictures submitted to PaLM will become the property of PaLM for our use and at our discretion. However, you will receive a by-line or some acknowledgement of your contribution unless you request to remain anonymous.

In case you were not aware, the IRS allows volunteers to deduct their "out-of-pocket" costs incurred while providing their donated services.
